

Our 2023 social calendar is filling up thanks to the tireless planning by Laurina. DOCKS & FLOATS

It is time to start planning for a new season. We will be launching the docks on April 1. We have a 9 am high tide and will be starting at 7 a.m. again and hopefully be done by 1 p.m. Work parties will start the first Saturday in March and we will be sending out reminder announcements via e-mails. The Board has adopted a new policy for member's use of the slips that the Commodore will cover. The important change is that members will be able to make a reservation on Dockwa for overnight discounted stays. There will not be any changes to the Dock Rules or Slip Rules this year. The work planned for the docks this spring will be to continue creating removable sections of the decking to allow the installation and removal of the electric cables in the docks for the stanchions and to move two stanchions and add two additional cleats to each slip and general maintenance. We are not planning any big projects but this is an easy way to fulfill your work hours early in the season.

We have had very good response to the three member-only slips and will be continuing to have three dedicated slips. Please remember that their use is limited to five hours on weekdays and one hour on weekends and the member must be aboard and no overnight stays. These slips are primarily work slips and slips to take on and discharge passengers and for use when the launches are not running and not for cocktails, serving hors d'oeuvres or lunch. We will continue to have a separate work area for members waiting for outside contractors that will take longer than 5 hours.

Members' use of the three slips, when you arrive after launch hours or leaving before we resume the launch, will not be changing. Moving your vessel to your mooring after the launch resumes operation is still the rule.


DOCKS & FLOATS



2023 Racing Schedule Posted!

Notes: The 'Harbor Cup' will be a week later than usual, on June 24th. And since the 4th of July is on a Tuesday, we will have that week's "Tuesday" race on Wednesday the 5th.

Course Changes!

We are expanding the course size to be 1.5 nm across instead of the current 1.0 nm. This will allow longer legs which is better for the Spin boats, and allows more tactical opportunities for all boats. The actual courses will be approximately the same total length, as they will be adjusted to still target a total race time of 1 to 1.5 hrs on Tuesday Nights. However, due to the size, and also some other changes to keep the inshore marks offshore, they will not be quite as 'symmetric' as before. So refresh yourselves with how to set marks/waypoints in your GPSs!

We will also be renaming the 'SF' mark to 'X'. This is to better indicate that the RC is free to move the start and/or finish to other marks should conditions warrant.

And, John Baker and John Doherty have come up with a way of applying a reflective surface to the SF mark, to make it more visible at night.

This is not set in stone (or anchored to the bottom) yet, so stay tuned in case we have to tweak it. A chart can be found on the next page showing the changes. Input welcome.


2023 Proposed Racing Chart


