#### **DOCKS & FLOATS**

We have done some exploratory work on the docks in preparation for replacing the decking and any rotten framing. In the three docks opened up so far we have found one in need or replacing some 3 x 10 band joists because of rot. The decking lumber was a special order and has been delivered to the lower lot. I have seen interest by members that volunteered to work on the docks before work parties are scheduled to start in March. If any member has some time before March work parties start, we can use help in removing the THOUSANDS of screws in the existing decking. If you do have time and remove the screws be sure I know how many hours you put in. The stainless steel screws for the new decking have been ordered. I think the work we are doing this spring will add another 30 years to the life of the docks in the marina Work parties will start March 1, subject to weather so we can get five work parities in before the docks are scheduled to be launched.

Dockwa is up and running for 2025 and we are confirming reservations. We have the Masthead Cove Yacht Club that will be returning on Memorial Day weekend and we have reserved a block or mooring and slips for them. .

We had two members give up their slips for 2025. Brian Selltiz is being offered a slip. He has a 32' power boat that he previously kept in Danfords. We have one additional slip that will be assigned by the time the Bowspritz is distributed to a member on the waiting list. Slip reassignments will be held to a minimum but will have to be made as the new slip members' boats are not good matches to the vacated slips.




