CRITICAL PATH - DEFINITION

- In project management, the *critical path* is the longest sequence of tasks that must be completed to execute a project.

DOCKS & FLOATS

Our docks are being built, the electrician has been hired and our new ramp is waiting to be delivered. Our second work party was March 9 with 17 members in attendance and we completed many projects and probably need two more work days to be ready for the new docks. We have met with the dock builder and he has started building our new docks and we are in contact with the piling contractor. We had some members change their minds about being slip holders but all the slips are spoken for by members and we have a nice variety of lengths of boats that fit nicely into the slip sizes we have envisioned and we have a waiting list.

At the beginning of the season I like to remind all members of the dock use guidelines and especially for the three "members-anytime" use slips. We also have changed those slips to W1, W2 and W3. If you would like assistance docking, call the launch drivers or ask for a dockhand to assist. If the drivers are on a run you may have to wait a short time. If all member slips are occupied, ask our drivers or dockhands if any transient slips are not reserved for transients. The most important item to remember is that these slips are restricted to 5 hours use on Monday to Thursday and one hour on Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays to make them available for pick up, off loading, etc. Overnight stays in these slips are not allowed and you need to be nearby. If you are in need of a slip while waiting for repairs, coordinate it with a driver on duty or the Directors of Launch or Docks. My cell is 631495-0985 or <u>docks@portjeffersonyachtclub.com</u>.
