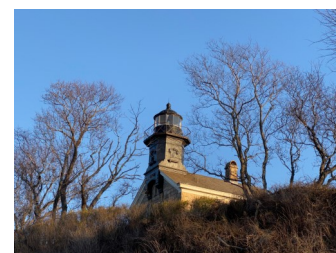

VICE COMMODORE

I was going to write about how things are starting to look up as our lives and the club are starting to return to normal. Or about the great cocktail party last month, or that the Fishing tournament, Harbor Cup, Village Cup and club cruises are all on the calendar this year. Or that races will be with full crew and that there are plenty of social events on the calendar and the bar is open again on Friday nights with a brand spanking new patio heater on the deck under our soon to be brand spanking new awning. Or that the yard has undergone a super spring cleaning, the dock house has been renovated, the docks fitted for next year's expansion, the JSP dock expanded and the JSP registrations are filling up fast. Or that we will be hosting a new member night for all the new members from this year and last. But, you know all that, so instead, I will write about one of our favorite destinations Flax Pond. Well, many of you may already know all about Flax Pond too but read on anyway.

Flax Pond is a tidal wetland just a short sail or motor just west of the harbor entrance about midway between Old Field Point and Crane Neck Point. There is good anchorage in the sound, just north of the beach – do not try to go into the pond with your boat. For those with a sailboat, the water is fairly deep as you approach the shore and the sandy bottom holds well, bring a dinghy to get to shore. The southwest breeze and the current should keep your boat pointing toward the beach. If you have a shallow draft boat just pull in close to the beach. The water is pretty deep but always check your charts in advance and know the tide.

We find that the west side of the inlet has a larger beach with better access to the pond and inlet. Be sure to bring water shoes since, like most north shore beaches, the beach is rocky in spots with many shells. After several dinghy rides back and forth, with all of our troops ashore we either just relax and enjoy the sun and the breeze or more often go for a float in the “lazy river” - the “lazy river” being the inlet to the pond. Since flax pond is tidal, as the tide goes out the pond empties into the sound, via the inlet, creating a little stream. As the tide floods, the water flow reverses and the water flows back into the pond. The water in the pond is very warm and with an outgoing tide, the current will float you gently down the river and dump you into the colder water of the sound. Whether the tide is incoming or outgoing, it's a lot of fun. Be sure to bring a foam noodle, PFD or other float to enjoy the ride. If you're not into soaking in the sun on the beach or floating around the inlet, bring a kayak or paddle board and explore the wetlands of the pond just remember no motorized boats are allowed in the pond.

REAR COMMODORE

Starting this year we will be using DockWa to accept summer/winter dinghy rack applications. This will streamline the process and allow members to pay the \$50 per boat fee via credit card.

You can also sign up for winter storage at the same time or wait until the fall if your plans are uncertain. Winter storage is an additional \$50 per boat.

Small Boat members can store one boat at no additional charge on the dinghy racks. However, additional boats are \$50 per boat. The winter storage charge is not included in your membership dues so the \$50 per boat charge applies.

If you do not have an account with DockWa, it is free and enables you to make on-line reservations at marinas and yacht clubs, such as PJYC.

You will have to create a new boat (or boats) for your dinghy/kayak in DockWa and call it either T/T big boat name, kayak, dinghy, catamaran etc. as well as basic information such as name (if applicable), length, beam etc. In the “Year” field can you type your hull color as this will make it easier to identify kayaks.

If you have an engine we will require its registration and for boats that have insurance, the company name and policy number. Unfortunately, registration and insurance is a required field in DockWa so just enter “no” for these fields and today's date if it does not apply. Same for the “Request” box where you can enter “Dinghy/Kayak Storage Request” and the desired rack number if you have a preference. As mentioned above, you can also request winter storage at this time. DockWa also requires you to select either power or sail. We know a kayak is neither so just select power as the default.

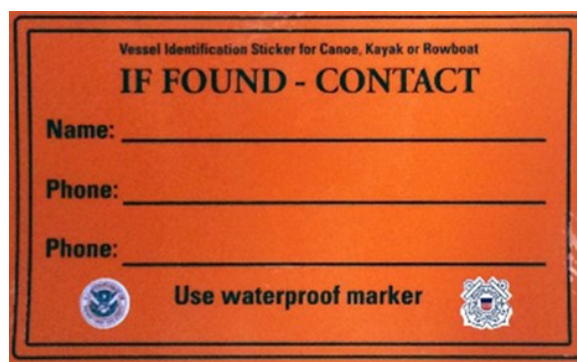

Once the application is submitted via DockWa, it will be approved and a contract created. You will then sign it electronically and return along with your credit card payment. A message will be sent via DockWa informing you of your rack number.

A PJYC sticker will be available in the dock house that is to be affixed to your boat. As in prior years, a Coast Guard lost boat sticker will also be available in the dock house. Please make sure your boat has this sticker and it remains legible as they tend to fade over time.

The DockWa link for dinghy registration is available on the members section of the PJYC website.

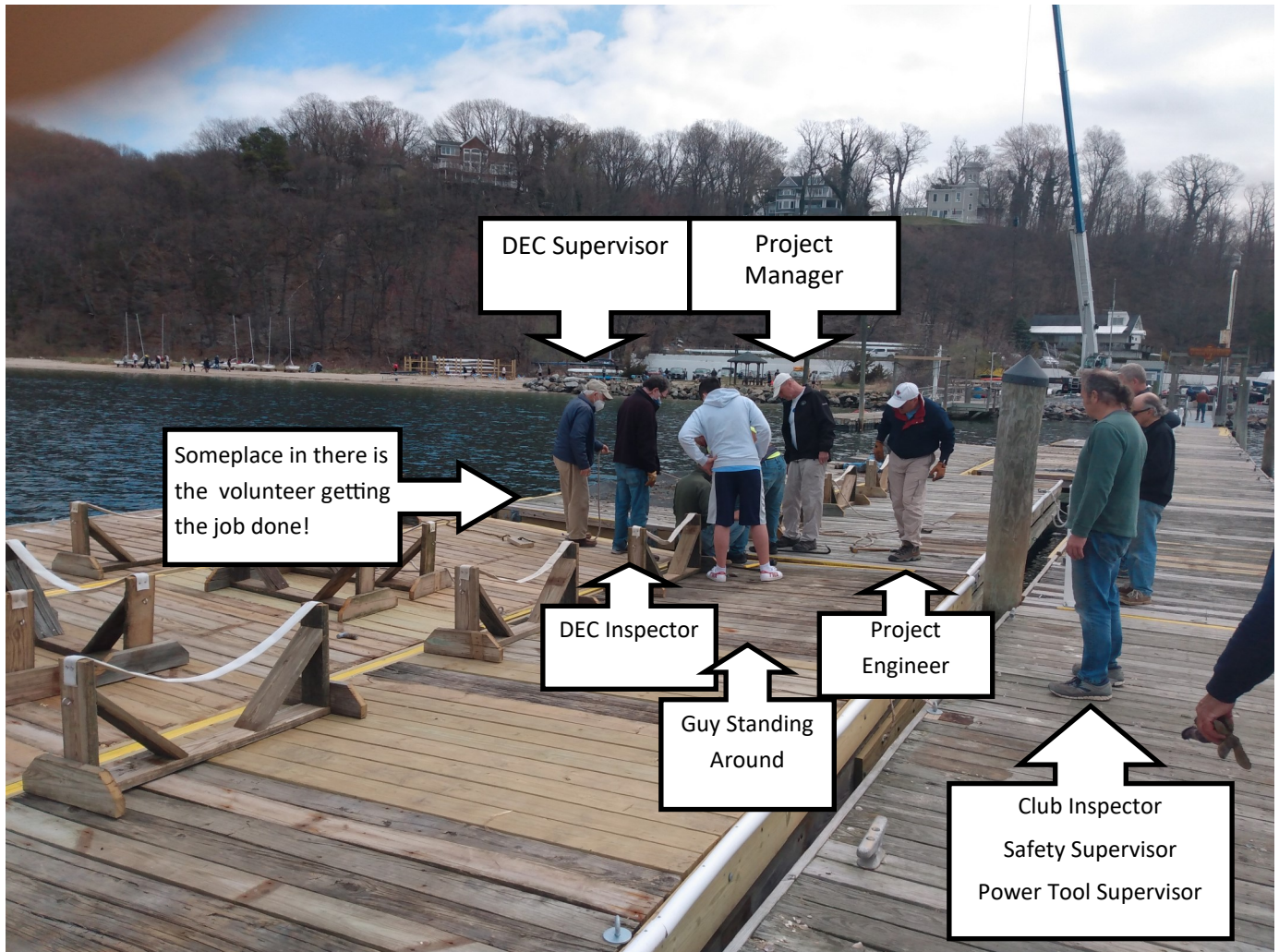

Double decker swept wing style tube. Durable Nylon top cover. Heavy duty PVC bladder. Skim-fast bottom for a slick and fast ride. Anti-chafe guard. 6 foam-filled handles with neoprene knuckle guards. Quick connect tow point. Inflated dimensions: 73.5" x 77" x 25.5". Deflated dimensions: 77" x 80". Max combined rider weight: 510 lbs.
