We have just launched and installed all 9 finger piers but due to weather were unable to complete all tasks because of the weather on May 6. The contractor will return as soon as weather improves and he will finish the installation. I have taken many pictures that I hope Dave Hubbard will be able to use. As of Fri. May 6, evening we had a couple of pilings to place between the slips, the rollers on both the docks and pilings and true up a couple of piling slightly off center pilings. The electric and water are complete to our entire "marina" as we have some signage to install making it crystal clear our East dock and West dock and the assigned slip numbers.

We have had some communication with William Demorest, Brookhaven Bay Constable concerning speed of the ferries in the Federal Channel. The speed limit is 5 MPH and regardless of the speed, the ferry is responsible for damage causes by his wake. If anyone on our dock sustains damage, please let me know and we will go to the cameras get proof over to the Bay Constable so he can deal with the ferry company. Please enjoy the pictures; I have no work parties planned yet, but watch for announcements. Hoping everyone get their boats launched without trauma. Get ready for a great summer and a new Port Jefferson Yacht Club.







GROUNDS

Thank you for all the volunteering. I cannot keep up with all the generous offers of help, but I sure will try, and our Grounds will look most welcoming for all your efforts.

Finished jobs are:

- Thanks to significant repair of the winter-damaged outdoor plumbing led by Ed Nielsen, our water to the lower level was running on April 7.
- Removed leaves in rear outdoor seating area in back/side of Clubhouse.
- An old Laser hull was picked up by someone who could really use it.
- A broken trailer was discarded.
- SBU Crew completed mulching, also in the garden along the front gate in the lower lot.
- Removed branches growing into the back of the JSP roof.

Planned jobs are:

- SBU Rowing started with sanding and sealing the railings going to the docks. Another coat if sealing is still necessary.
- JSP Patching holes with Concrete
- JSP Painting south wall.
- JSP Paint steps blue.
- JSP Remove items, paint floor, epoxy grit paint. David Diamond will have items removed. Mitch Slochower will powerwash and paint floor.
- JSP Clean platform. Per David Diamond, in the beginning of June the boats will be moved from the platform to the floating docks. So, this would be a good time to clean the platform, specifically trim and remove branches, leaves, and powerwash the platform.
- Lot, lower Stain new fence near platform. SBU Sailing painted one side of the fence, and will also paint the other side.

- Lot, lower Paint new covers for water facilities.
- Propane Solicit a Propane Manager.
- Gas tanks Communicate a policy. (Not inside the house! Not on the Grounds! Gas tanks need to go into the Flammable Storage Cabinet on the platform near the JSP building.)
- Planting Plant along edge of upper lot.
- Planting Hanging baskets.
- Planting Remove weeds growing in the upper lot edge.
