No cost, but you have to reserve it. See the website under 'Members Only' and in the 'Useful Links and Forms' box you will see a link that takes you to a reservations calendar

page.

Coordinates: 40° 57′ 48″ N by 73° 5′ 54″ W (For Decimal Minutes: 40 57.80 by –73 5.90) Yellow Top Labeled "PJYC". East end of Conscience Bay, South of the CB channel.

There are a few rules, explained on that page:

- Up to 3 boats may raft up overnight. Only one member needs to reserve it.
- Please be off the mooring by 11 AM the next morning for others coming in.
- Generally, arrival time is after noon. However, if it is not in use, you can reserve it for any period of time during the day.

2025 PJYC FISHING TOURNAMENT

Welcome to the Party

The 16th annual PJYC Fishing Tournament went off very smoothly from Friday, June 6 through Sunday, June 8. Mother Nature provided a mix of sun, clouds, rain and wind to that allowed thirty-seven anglers to go out all three days, although sometimes in very difficult conditions. The result was a festive and enjoyable event in which two first time winners took the top awards for both the fluke and the porky categories. Helene Flynn landed a 3.69 pound Fluke aboard the Big Byte to take home the trophy. Fishing aboard his own vessel the Nelly May, Tom Aronson brought in a 1.46 pound Porgie to top all contenders in that category. Due to the unusually cold spring conditions prior to the tournament no bluefish or striped bass were caught. The High Hook award is presented to the angler who catches the most fish in each of the three days of the tournament. John Doherty was the high hook winner on Friday with 20 fish. On Saturday Jenn Roberts took the high hook award with 19 fish. And on Sunday, Megan Broderick was presented the high Hook medallion for landing 13 fish.

The Dog Fish Derby Mug is presented to the captain of the vessel who landed the most Sea Robbins during the course of the three-day tournament. This year that distinction went to Tim Rachek whose crew landed an average of 3.69 dogfish per person.

As has been the case for the previous 15 tournaments the success of this year's event sat squarely on the shoulders of the dedicated team of Fishing Tournament committee members

who worked tirelessly to make this tournament a resounding success. The efforts of Ellie Bowman, Kevin and Patty Broderick, Dianna and Alan Rosenblum, Connie Siris, Jean and John Doherty and the three remarkable new additions, Annette and Ray Dickinson and Justin Siris allowed for this tournament to be an enjoyable and upbeat experience from the registration online and ability to order commemorative apparel via the website to the fun filled awards reception.




