Docks and Floats

In order to make the most use of our docks and ensure that everyone can enjoy them, please try to observe the following guidelines. Pull your boat to either the very north end or the south end of the dock so that others may pull up behind or in front of you. When you tie up with 30 feet of empty dock space in front of you, your 30 footer becomes a 60 footer. Larger boats should try to tie up with their bow out beyond the end of the dock. And as always, lend a helping hand to these coming in to tie up at the dock. Thanks for your consideration.

Dock Book

The Board realizes that there will be times and conditions that require a member's boat to be on the dock for a time period that exceeds the limit specified in the dock rules. To lessen the confusion of you telling a dock staff and them telling their replacement it has been decided that members are to sign into the dock book when their boat is to be on the dock for an extended period of time. The book will be in the dock house and will include columns for date, name of boat, member's name, contact phone, reason for the extended stay, and when the boat will be removed. It is the member's responsibility to sign in.
