UPDATES FROM THE OFFICERS AND DIRECTORS

DOCKS & FLOATS

The summer is flying by and we are now in the planning stages to pull the docks out on Nov. 2. We have a 12:22 p.m. high tide which is perfect. This is a rain or shine date so please mark your calendars. Because of the increase in the number of docks from prior years this will be more organized and not look like a free for all. If we remove a single dock and land it in the lower lot every five minutes, it will take five and one half hours. We are developing a plan to make this happen.

The dock contractor returned and replaced the lighter duty hoops with a heavier duty model on the finger docks he supplied in the spring and I hope you have noticed the new ladders installed on the main dock. Please familiarize yourself with them and how to deploy them for use. We have also added floating rings and drainage pipe rollers on two of the pilings on the main dock to help protect the boats using the adjacent slips.

Looking back on the installation and construction of the new docks I think we have maximized our use of the waterfront. If you have any ideas for future improvements, please contact me with your ideas. The contractors we used were great. Getting them to return for items left open or missed was done promptly, our electric installation is safe and working with stable voltage to all the stanchions and the new docks are performing as designed and all piling work has been completed. If any member has suggestions for future improvements, please contact me. I would highly recommend these contractors to anyone needing marine construction.

Dockwa has become a vital part of our reservation system and without it or a similar system we would be hard pressed. Revenue thru the end of July compared to the end of July in 2023 is up 19%. This increase was accomplished with the same assets that we had last year. We have the same number of mooring and transient slips.

I am looking for an individual to take over the supervision of our Dockwa reservation system. It requires a dedicated individual to look it over with a critical eye. The day to day mechanics of Dockwa is done by our waterfront staff by both our launch drivers and the dock staff. I found that as Director of Docks and Floats I am spending more time on Dockwa than the docks I was elected to oversee and we are looking for a volunteer to supervise Dockwa on a continual basis, confirming the reservations are in the proper slips, eliminating conflicts, keeping track of the slip holders out of their slip so we can rent them, etc. The program is easy to learn and it can be done on a smart phone, tablet or computer. This is an easy way to assimilate and meet members and provide a valuable service to the club. Contact me if you are interested.




