

DOCKS & FLOATS

The installation of the dock edging bumpers is moving along. Tim Knoll has taken it upon himself to install the bumpers in the transient slips and Michael De Nicola has completed the member only slips and about 50% on the member assigned slips have been done by the members themselves. Combined, we have installed 60% of the dock rub rail. An unseen benefit of the edging is that you no longer have to deploy your bumpers as you enter the slips. Using the roller balls on the ends of the finger piers, we can enter the slips without deploying the fenders and getting them mixed up with the rollers and after you are in the slip, deploy the fenders for added protection.

The pile of bumper edging in the lower lot is a lot smaller and will make for an easier job in the spring. Unfortunately, because of the way we must stack the finger piers tightly together, 50% of the finger pier edging will not be available or visible and any edging not done on those will have to wait to be done after the launching of the docks and after the water and power are reinstalled next spring so please install your rub rail if you have not already done so.

We noticed some of the night lights were out on the stanchions. Some of the lights were the old style fluorescents and most of the newer were already LED. We have replaced ALL the bulbs with new LED's and we have some spares available.





CRUISING

Hello from the Annual PJYC Long Cruise! We started Friday, Aug 1 in Essex, CT, with a group dinner at the Essex Yacht Club, including the crews of Lively Up, Adamas, Smoke & Mirrors and Anelique. Unfortunately Ripple was delayed because of the high winds and rough seas (3-5' swells) on that Thursday afternoon and Friday. However, the weather cleared on Saturday, and we had a flotilla of 4 boats (Ripple, Pesaro, Barbaros, and Kinsale) leave Port Jeff between 4:30 and 5:30 am to get to Essex in time for the annual Lions Club Lobster Bake, the traditional kick-off for the long cruise. All together, we had 21 PJYC members and guests at the Lobster Bake, including Ray and Annette Dickenson, who came by car.

From Essex, 5 boats sailed on to Stonington, where we were also joined by Harvest Moon, and then on to 3rd Beach, a beautiful spot recommended by Deb and John Baker. Unfortunately, Deb and John ended up staying in Essex for two extra days because of engine troubles, but since then, they have made their own adventure cruising around Block Island and Narragansett Bay, and plan to rejoin the larger group this week when they return to Block. We were also sad to say goodbye to Smoke & Mirrors at 3rd Beach, as they turned toward home for family events.

From 3rd Beach, we sailed up Buzzards Bay and then through Woods Hole, hitting it just before slack tide and avoiding the strong adverse currents in Vineyard Sound. We stayed one night in Vineyard Haven, before heading east to our furthest destination, Nantucket. Three nights in Nantucket gave us lots of time for walking, biking, shopping, and eating.


