I think a question on everyone's mind is how are we doing financially? When the pandemic first shut down businesses we did not know how we would weather this storm. We had an aggressive revenue projection for the Junior Sail Program and we believed moorings and docks would bring in the same revenue as last year. We adopted a bare bones budget, with only necessities approved. James Finke, our Junior Sail Program Director increased the fleet size and was able to begin a fall program. We did not meet the revenue budget but we did much better than anticipated. Revenue was off less than 10%. Moorings and docks did as well as last year. We are still working on finalizing revenues from these two important programs. The club did well this year financially despite the slow start to the season.

The final race was held on September 1st, with good wind, and a 3 foot swell coming down the sound from the east. And we all finished in the dark!

We had remarkably close racing with several positions tied on points, in which case the tie is broken by whoever wins the last race between the two boats. To keep the crowd of boats down at the start and around marks, we split the fleet into two divisions. All the boats sailed non-spinnaker, and short-handed this year with only 2 crew. Very challenging.

After delaying the race due to Small Craft Advisories, we still ended up canceling due to extreme conditions on the sound. 4 to 5 foot seas, with at least one up around 7 (the top part of which landed in my lap!), were piling up due to 25 – 30 kt winds from the NNE. A couple of boats braved the conditions to check out the situation, but we decided to call it a day. It was a great day to sail around the harbor though!

Village Cup Regatta

2020 has proven to be one of the strangest years in memory. The Covid-19 pandemic with its ensuing shutdown has profoundly affected all of us – some tragically.

Back in early March we had to plan as to how we could or should proceed. At that time, we thought that we had no choice but to cancel. We informed Mayor Garant, Mather and the Lustgarten Foundation. All of whom fully understood.

When June came around the Village Cup Regatta Committee met via Zoom. We realized that while the community outreach portion of the Village Cup was not possible this year, it may still be possible to hold the charitable portion of the event. However, we were concerned that the shutdown may have had a serious financial impact on many of our members and other outside donors. In the end, we decided to go forward with the fund raising for our charities. Pancreatic Cancer is as prevalent and deadly as ever and this year, Mather's share of its donations would go toward their Covid-19 response.

I am pleased to report that even with the financial impact of Covid, the Port Jefferson Yacht Club managed to raise over forty thousand dollars (\$40,000)! That brings the total monies donated by our foundation to the Lustgarten Foundation and Mather Hospital to six hundred and forty-two thousand dollars (\$642,000). Congratulations! We thank all of you who were able to participate in this challenging year. As with previous years, the complete list of donors will be attached below (club members have been bolded).
