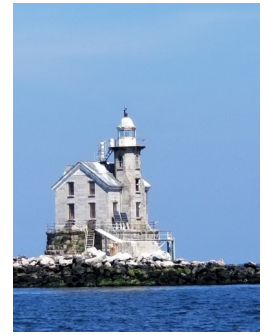

The docks are scheduled to come out on **November 6**. The crane will be there ready to start work at 8 am and so will we. I will be sending out a reminder the week before. Rich Coward has once again volunteered to coordinate the members and the crane operation to insure a safe operation. This past summer has been extremely successful and repair free season on the docks with transient income reaching all time highs. We will have the finals for the season early November. Final plans are being made for the finger piers with movement on the part of the USACORE (Army Corps). They have put out our application out for public comment which is limited to 20 days, which will be completed on Oct. 20, 2021 and this is the last hurdle for the issuance of a building permit. The Board has tentatively set up a list of members based on the year joined and then alphabetically by their last name to establish a “slip list” of eligibility based on total length of voting membership years. We hope to have this for the annual meeting. Vic Suben has stepped forward and now is supervising Dockwa reservation until we hire staff for next year and then he will have assume a more supervisory role.

Next year we will start charging transients a fee for not leaving the moorings or dock space by check out time. We have the most liberal cancellation and check in and out time that I have seen in print. We are changing the reservation script sent to every transient advising them of the charges they will incur for not leaving before check out time and the charges will be added to their Dockwa bill and checkout time will be confirmed by our cameras. Any disputes will be settled by a screen shot. We are a private club and the transients are guests and we expect them to act as such.

VILLAGE CUP

So, 2021 became an excellent year for our club's Village Cup Regatta. We had a breakout year in 2019 which saw us give \$92,000 to our charities (28% more than our previous high), only to see the covid pandemic force a cancellation of the race and party in 2020. Contributions fell to \$40,000.

This year, with the easing of covid and its restrictions, the membership enthusiastically participated in both the race and the charitable fund raising. Over one hundred of you joined in and produced the best Village Cup ever. Thirty boats took part with twenty-six racers, three spectator/press and the committee boat. We raised an astonishing \$109,500 which brings our 12-year total to just over \$750,000.

The Village Cup fell on the 20th anniversary of 9/11 this year. We paid tribute to that day by dedicating the memorial Parade of boats to include all those lost on 9/11; Sally Hausner led the vocal group, Sweet Adaline, with national anthem and Alan Siris, our Poet Laureate, recited a moving poem he had written about that day.

We had a hand made; cedar sea kayak given to our foundation by an anonymous doner. The kayak was stored in a garage for years. The Bayles Boat Shop agreed to donate their services to bring it back to its original beauty. We raise \$3,700 raffling the kayak which was won by club member Johnny Slade. Thanks to Phil Schiavone who spearheaded Bayles's restoration, to Bayles for donating their time and expertise and to all the members who purchased raffle tickets.

Traditionally, this Bow Spritz article is an opportunity to recognize and thank the members who participated in the Village Cup this year. So many of you have that it becomes difficult to not mistakenly leave someone out. Please let me know if I have so that I can correct it in next month's issue.

First, I would like to thank my fellow committee members who began work on this year's Village cup back in April.

Skol has been our committee boat for every year (except for our first year). Through great effort, Don and Diane Mackenzie were able to step in with Hylander. Also on Hylander were Alan Johnson (shotgun); Meara & Andi Kelly (Fags & horn); Vicki LaRossa (timer) Leighann Kelly (scorer) & Charlie Masone (Race Official).

Our Spectator fleet included Kevin & Patti Broderick on Water Hazard; Kevin & Janet Mularky on Alosa; Joseph & Hope Kinney on Blue Moon and Aaron Rubin on Sea Rose 2. Also, thanks to Alan Rosenblum who was to be our press boat for the 12th year but took ill just before the regatta. A special thanks to Kevin & Patti Broderick who stepped up and volunteered Water Hazard as this year's press boat.

Of course, a very big thanks to all the race boat captains & crews who donated their time, their boats and their friendships to make the Village Cup the wonderful event it has become.

Finally, I want to thank the entire membership for its incredible, enthusiastic support of the Village Cup. Your participation and donations have made this a noteworthy event. We are making a difference!

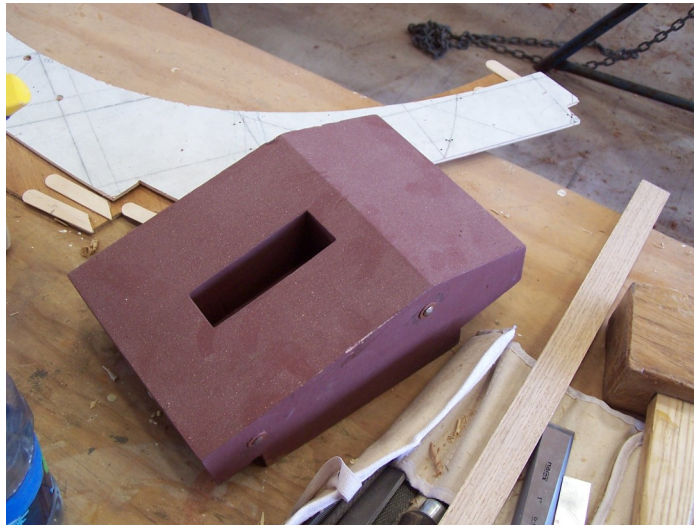
WHAT'S IT?

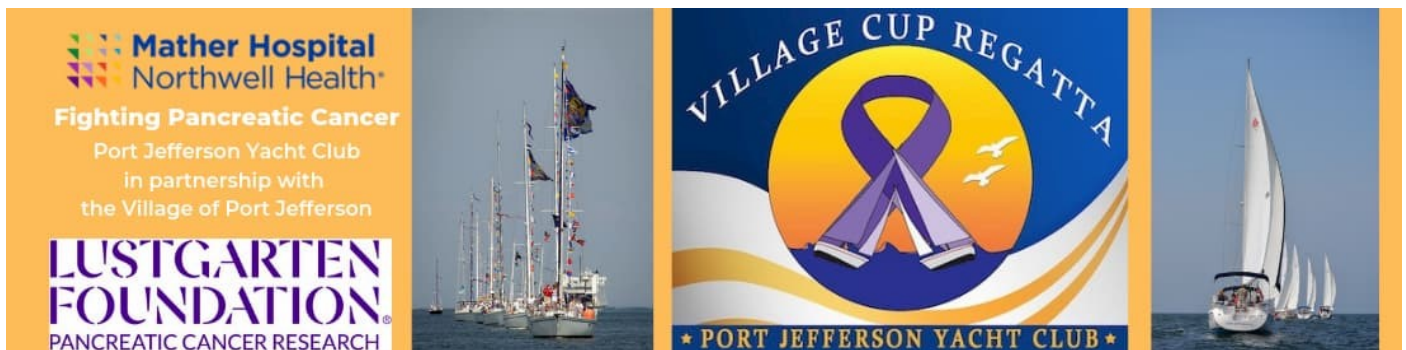
