Docks and Floats November 2018

Hopefully, by the time you read this, the docks will have been placed in the lower lot.

Damage and repairs to the docks have been next to zero for the entire season. Every thing was going great on the docks until S/V Jeremiah was docked on the east dock on the evening of 10/17/18 with the stern facing weather, causing untold damage to the north float on the east dock. Full assessment of



damage will have to wait for the dock removals and dismantling. Jeremiah was on the dock in violation of published dock rules. An additional dock rule has been adopted by the board and will be in the new year-book. The docks and the boats docked, have repeatedly damaged themselves and the docks when high winds come out of the north. As a result of the damage caused, the Board thought it necessary for a rule change.

I think a brief summary of transient dockage is in order. Last year, we raised \$16,780 in transient dock income, 2017 we raised \$8,300, 2016 "0". 2018 we had 149 boats on the docks, 2017 71 boats and 2016 "0". Going forward, transients on the dock will be limited to five boats max, weekday and weekends. The staff will be instructed to put the first two boats on the East dock and then if necessary use the North end of the West dock. We are expanding the electrical outlets on the east dock and the end of the west dock to accommodate the boats. During the JSP season there may be some modifications.
