DOCKS & FLOATS

I write this at the end of an exhausting day. All docks have been taken out and are winter stored. The list for repairs has already started but we will have a much shorter list than last year. We started this season with 17 floating docks, the most we have ever had and finished with 20 floating docks. Historically, we have been able to finish the launch and retrieval of the docks in 4 hours. With the three extra docks, it took and additional one half hour and we will be able to improve on that after we rebuild the three new to us docks and equip them with lifting eyes. We continue to improve the docks with the hope of minimizing the time required to safely launch and retrieve the docks and I think we have done a wonderful job. The turnout from the membership has been outstanding with many members putting in many, many hour over the minimum and I thank you sincerely and seeing new members their was a treat. We would not have the equipment we have now without your dedication.

If all goes well, we will have many more docks and opportunities next year with the finger piers and added electric. The dock have been laid out so that we can do all of the electric cabling and new electric stanchions while the docks are on the hard except for ONE dock that will have to be done in the water and rebuild the three new to us docks.
