DOCKS & FLOATS

April 2 started a little chilly, but the crane arrived at 8 AM and we started moving the docks and floats into position. Amazingly, by 12 noon we had launched all 20 docks. The member turn out was at an all time high. We have so many returning members that they are able to guide the newer members. The next week we installed the remaining three stanchions and cut the access holes for the electric wiring in the docks that were buried. The pilings have been delivered and the finger piers are due to be delivered by April 9 and we hope to start installing the pilings and finger piers the week of April 11. The electric cables installation in the docks is expected around April 9 and then we will have members wire up the stanchions. It has been a lot of planning, but we are almost done. Now that we are becoming more like a marina, we have decided to work on the slip numbering system. We will still have the East and West dock. The West and East dock slips will now be numbered and the Dockwa assignment page has been updated. Our primary transient dock will be the face dock. Slips on the West side will have odd numbers. The face dock(transient) will be slip 1 followed by 3, 5, 7, 9, 11,(these will be permanent member slips), followed by slips 13, 15,

17, (these slips are unassigned so that all members have a short term slip to work on there boats, charge batteries, take on and discharge passengers, etc.). These three slips are for short term stays within dock rules and the member must be working on his boat or be near by (maybe picking up material at West Marine, etc.). The next two slips are permanent slips for the launches and finally our permanent dinghy dock.

The dinghy dock is for member and transient use. The only permanent dinghies on this dock will be the two university teams while school is open, and they are practicing. Having a numbering system will make it possible to rent out the permanent slips when the members are out cruising to visiting boaters and will increase our revenue stream. The East dock is identified as slip one and two. Again, odd number on the West side and even on the east. These are transient slips. This leaves aprox 100 ft of dock space on the West dock unassigned. The along side dock south of slip 12 is for long term tie up for boats broken down, awaiting repairs, new sails, or as I have done preparing my boat for a round trip to

Bermuda. I needed to provision and get the boat ready. Boats can be left here awaiting repairs over night and without the member present. Please, call the dock house and confirm space is available in the member short term slips before docking. We would also like to accommodate members in the transient slips if they are not assigned. Again, call the drivers to confirm space is available before docking.

DOCKS & FLOATS

All of our docks are now equipped with the lifting rings and the finger piers will also have the lifting eyes. When we started launching the docks ourselves, we started with 9 docks. We now launch 20 docks in the same amount of time and crane charges. In the fall with an additional 18 lifts, we will have a learning curve, but with everybody's energies and

cooperation we will surely succeed.

The Board has also opened up our transient slips to members not assigned a permanent slip space to rent a transient slip at a 50% discount from published rates. This is for short term use and is as space is available subject to availability.



NEW! Dinghy Storage!

We have a new to us floating dock moored to the South of the JSP floating dock. It has three cradles. The board has decided to open this up to launch members that have dinghies and small sail boats. The rentals will be priced at \$200 for a cradle spot, and \$150 to just pull a dinghy up on the dock. We will have 3 cradles, and room for perhaps 9 dinghies pulled up. Contracts are available on Dockwa just like the rack storage. Gas can be stored in the dinghies and motors at your discretion and liability. Gas cannot be carried in the launches. Now, instead of carrying your dinghy from the rack, down the ramp and launch it every time you want to use it, have the launch drive you out, launch it and tow it out to your boat when you need it. The dinghies will have to be entirely on the float because we expect to use it for transient boaters when out existing mooring are full.





I have three symmetrical spinnakers that I can bring if anyone is interested. I plan to try and sell them for less than \$500 each. All three sails have numbers on them (25261), and have a luff/leach of 42' 9", and a foot of 23' 9".


The .75 oz. has a few patches and a few hanging threads at some seams. It appears to be the oldest of the three.

The 1.5 oz. appears the newest of the three, and in the best condition.

The runner looks just as good as the 1.5 oz, but maybe not as new, and has one small patch. It has broader shoulders, and appears to be the same weight as the 1.5 oz. All three sails seem to be in good (the .75 oz) to very-good (the other two) condition, and come with launching bags. The only one I have hoisted, and had to chance to see in its entirety, is the runner.




