

I am happy to report that all docks are winter stored. We were able to stack the docks so that any work authorized and needed work on the docks can be performed. We had no accidents or injuries. My planning seemed to work nicely as all the docks fit where I had envisioned. While we did not store a dock every 5.5 minutes we did average a dock every 6 minutes but with 66 docks it still took 6.5 hours of crane time. We had the crane show up 30 minutes before the membership as it takes him 30 minutes to set up. Our start time was scheduled for 8:30 and we had our first dock in the air at 8:38. This worked so well that we will use this format in the future and I will prepare an instructional hand off to my successor next year. No reason to reinvent the wheel. The docks are all in position so

that if we get a budget, all decking on the main dock can be replaced, upgrades to the electric cables feeding the electrical stanchion can partially be done on the hard and the security gate can be added over the winter if it is approved and constructed. We had not issues with unstable electric or the water on the docks this season. Due to tides next April, we will be lunching the docks on April 12.



Looking back on our first year with the expanded marina I think it worked as designed. If any member has suggestions for improvements I would like to hear them. My observation is that we did not make adequate allowance for the larger boats that the members are acquiring. Possible solutions are a new Phase 3 but that would require more land, more docks and permits, or perhaps add a piling another ten feet from the end of the finger piers on slips N11 to N18 so that longer boats would be able to secure the bow or stern to a piling but not have a finger piers. This would allow us to accommodate longer boats without additional finger piers. Our North end slips have 17' beams which is a useable width. Anything would definitely require new permits and additional underwater leased land as we are built out to the limits of our license.

Reviewing the reported income from Mooring/slip rentals I would like to point out that combined we are 16.8% ahead of 2023 or 20K+ and 11.8% ahead of budget. . We welcomed over 1000 visitor last summer but what is very interesting 50% had never visited us in the past. We have become a destination harbor and a destination YC.

Proposed 2025 Season would be:

Reservation accepted starting 3/1/25

Closing of the yacht Club 10/30/25 for slips and mooring reservations to allow the start of winterization. Launch service ends 10/31.


Slip contract period 4/14 to 10/31/25

The docks will be removed on 11/8 next season. There is a terrible HT on 11/1 and 10/25. We could move it up to 10/25 but that has a 2:22 pm high tide. Not an ideal tide with the number of docks to be moved.






